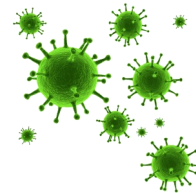

COVID-19 in Saskatchewan

As we are seeing an increase in the number of positive COVID-19 cases in the area, our restrictions and guidelines are ever-changing. While we may not all agree with the rules set out for us, it is imperative we all do our best to comply. We will get through this. TOGETHER.

- Keep your distance of 6 feet when in public places.
- Wash your hands often.
- Avoid touching your face.
- If you have a fever, STAY HOME.
- If you have a cough, sore throat, runny nose, shortness of breath, or difficulty breathing that are not attributed to seasonal or environmental allergies, STAY HOME.
- If you have a new onset of a headache, aches and pains, loss of sense of smell or taste, diarrhea, nausea/vomiting, loss of appetite, fatigue or weakness, STAY HOME.
- Limit your travel out of your community to necessary excursions only.
- Continually self monitor for any changes in symptoms. If you develop any symptoms, call 811 for a test referral.

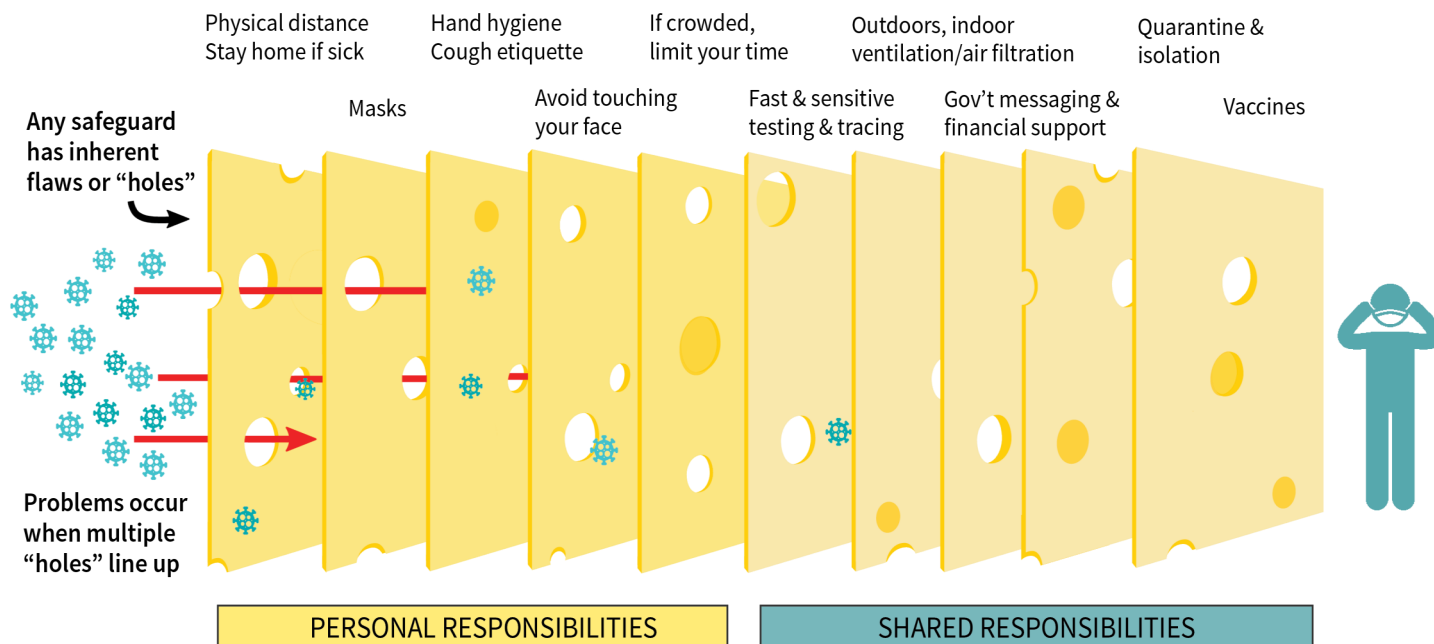

THE SWISS CHEESE RESPIRATORY VIRUS PANDEMIC DEFENCE

RECOGNIZING THAT NO SINGLE INTERVENTION IS PERFECT AT PREVENTING SPREAD



As illustrated above, non-medical and cloth masks are an additional step to help slow the spread of COVID-19 when combined with everyday preventative actions and physical distancing. **DO:**

- ♦ Wash your hands before putting on your face covering.
- ♦ Pull it over your mouth and nose, securing it under your chin.
- ♦ Fit it snugly around the sides of your face.
- ♦ Make sure you can breathe easily.
- ♦ Launder cloth masks after every use, in hot, soapy water. Let it completely dry before wearing it again.
- ♦ Replace your mask when dirty, soiled or wet.
- ♦ Avoid touching and adjusting the mask once it's on. If you touch your mask, wash or sanitize your hands.

To remove your mask:

- ♦ Untie the straps behind your head, or stretch the ear loops.
- ♦ Handle by the ear loops or ties.
- ♦ Fold outside corners together.
- ♦ Place used cloth covering in the washing machine; used disposable masks in a plastic lined garbage bin.
- ♦ Be careful not to touch your eyes, nose, and mouth when removing, wash hands immediately after your mask is removed.

Other things to keep in mind:

- ♦ Do not put the covering around your neck, up on your forehead, or hanging from one ear.
- ♦ Do not share your mask.
- ♦ Do not re-use disposable masks.
- ♦ Children under age two, anyone who has trouble breathing, is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance, should not wear cloth face coverings.



Due to Covid 19, the Spirit of Christmas concert has been cancelled, but we still want to keep the True Spirit of Christmas and gather food hampers.




